

Communication between Nursery and Parents/Carers

To do our best for the children we need the support and interest of parents in the education we provide. We believe children are happier and learn better when there is good communication between home and school. This works best when the links between the two are strong.

There are several ways in which we do this:

- Consultation Evenings: these take place twice a year – in the autumn and spring terms. This is an opportunity for parents/carers and teachers to discuss the progress of their child. The appointments are for 10 minutes per child.
- Tapestry: each child has their own tapestry account where the nursery team can upload pictures and observations of experiences, events and WOW moments. Through Tapestry, parents/carers are also invited to share home experiences too for example, riding their bike or days out. Each week, an overview of activities your child will have the opportunity to take part in will also be shared to enable parents/carers to see what will be happening the following week in nursery.
- Written Summaries: At the end of the summer term, your child's Tapestry journal will be printed out for you to keep along with a written summary of their time in nursery.
- Special Events and Assemblies: Throughout the year there will be opportunities for parents/carers to come into school to see in person their child's learning. We will always let parents know when they can come into school for special events or the regular class assemblies.
- Newsletter: A weekly school newsletter is sent each week containing lots of information regarding learning and events taking place in school as well as the local area. Please do take the time to read through and add any upcoming information to diaries.
- Contact with Class Teacher: We hope parents will also feel happy to approach the class teacher at any time if there are any queries or concerns about the school, but the end of a day is always better for this than when the children are entering.
