



## Pupils Mode of Travel

This new data source assists schools by providing:

- baseline data for schools wishing to start a travel plan
- a means to monitor and update existing travel plans
- information to help Hertfordshire County Council better support walking and cycling to school through travel plans, road safety education and Safer Routes to School highway engineering measures

Improving travel to school helps children be healthy, stay safe and, through their involvement in travel plans, make a positive contribution to the local and global environment.

Where a pupil uses more than one mode of travel for each journey to school, the longest element of the journey *by distance* should be recorded. For example a pupil who travels 5 miles by car and then walks the last mile to school, the pupil's usual mode of travel should be recorded as Car/Van. Car share covers both informal car share arrangements and formal car share schemes.

Boarding pupils should record their usual mode of travel as Boarder - not applicable.
