



## **Remote Education Provision: Information for parents.**

This information is intended to provide clarity and transparency to parents and carers about what to expect from remote education if local restrictions require bubbles to remain at home. This does not apply if your child is ill.

For details of what to expect where individual pupils are self-isolating, please see the final section of this document.

## **The Remote Curriculum**

A pupil's first day or two of being educated remotely will be different from our standard approach, while we take all necessary actions to prepare for a longer period of remote teaching.

## **What should my child expect from immediate remote education in the first day or two of pupils being sent home?**

For the first few days please use the interim packs that are already available on Google Classrooms. In the case of Year 1, 2 and 3 please ensure your child does some handwriting practise. All children Rec-year 4 to access [Bug Club](#), [Mathletics](#) and practice number bonds or times tables daily.

Following the first few days of remote education, the teachers will put work on Google Classrooms in line with what is being taught in school, where this is appropriate for translation to home learning.

## **How long can I expect work set by the school to take my child each day?**

We expect that remote education will take pupils broadly the following number of hours each day:

- Foundation stage 1 hour
- KS1 2-3 hours
- KS2 3 -4 hours

## **Accessing remote education**

The work will be set via Google Classroom. All parents should have already logged in. If you are having technical issues please contact the school via [admin@icknielwalk.herts.sch.uk](mailto:admin@icknielwalk.herts.sch.uk)

### **If my child does not have digital or online access at home, how will you support them to access remote education?**

We recognise that some pupils may not have suitable online access at home.

If you cannot access the Google Classroom as you do not have suitable equipment we will endeavor to provide you with a Chrome Book or tablet. If we do not have enough of these or they are unsuitable for your child, we can provide you with a printed copy of the work.

We will use a combination of the following approaches to teach pupils remotely:

- recorded teaching (e.g. Oak National Academy lessons, audio recordings over PowerPoints made by teachers)
- ideas for activities and worksheets
- commercially available websites supporting the teaching of specific subjects or areas, including video clips or sequences
- long-term project work and/or internet research activities

## **Engagement and feedback**

We are aware that the vast majority of our children will need to be supported in some way with their learning at home. It is important to get into a routine of doing school work daily, however we are also aware that sometimes this will not be possible due to other family and work commitments.

We ask for the completed work to be uploaded on Google Classroom and this will then be checked by the class teacher. Feedback may not be given to every piece of work.

We will contact you by telephone if we feel that your child needs to engage more often with the work.

## **Additional support for pupils with particular needs**

**How will you work with me to help my child who needs additional support from adults at home to access remote education?**

We recognise that some pupils, for example some pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) will struggle with doing much formal school work at home and we will understand if not all the formal work is completed, we will talk to you individually about other useful activities that the children can do.

We will provide differentiated activities where this is appropriate.

## **Remote education for self-isolating pupils**

If it is just a small number of pupils self-isolating we would ask parents to use the interim work packs available on *Google Classroom* and then more work will be posted onto *Google classroom* for your child to access.

There is likely to be an emphasis on teaching via the *Oak Academy*.
