

A formal school uniform gives a feeling of shared identity within the school community and we believe this is important for all the children.

In producing this policy, the staff and governors have tried to ensure that all items are readily available and are as low cost as possible.

The key purposes of having a school uniform are:

- Helps to ensure your children keep as safe as possible
- To ensure practical clothing for the activities within the school
- To promote a feeling of shared identity within the school community
- Supports our belief that all children are equal

The expectation is that all pupils in reception to year 4 must wear school uniform.

General points on the school uniform:

- School logos on items of clothing are available but not compulsory
- All items of clothing, footwear and bags must be named

Suggestions on where items can be purchased from:

- Many items are available for purchase on-line through Schoolyard Limited in Royston.
- The PTA regularly hold second hand uniform sales, if you are struggling to pay for uniform in the sale, please talk to a member of staff who will be pleased to help you.
- Water bottles are available to buy from the school office.
- Most large supermarkets and department style stores also have dedicated school uniform sections both in store and online.

IWFS is an inclusive school. The Head Teacher will consider carefully (and where they feel necessary consult with the School Governing Body) any request that is made to vary the policy in any way to:

- meet the needs of any individual pupil to accommodate their religion or belief, taking into careful account the
 needs of all children to feel included in the school community and also to meet health and safety
 requirements.
- support a child with any permanent or temporary medical condition.
- support specific sensory needs of children

If a child is not wearing the correct uniform, a risk assessment will be made to decide if the child's clothes are appropriate for the activities. If necessary alternative clothing (such as changing open toed sandals for trainers) will be used. Parents will be contacted to ask them to provide suitable uniform in future. (Please note that there is a separate sun safe policy).

Our Nursery Children

Though school uniform is not compulsory in the nursery, we strongly encourage children to wear the polo shirt and the sweatshirt to help identify themselves as being part of the whole school.

We do encourage nursery children (both boys and girls) to wear jogging bottoms or elasticated shorts (rather than formal school trousers or a skirt and tights) as this makes independent toileting much easier.

- For safety reasons it is compulsory that all nursery children:
 - o meet the policy on jewellery
 - o wear shoes with a closed toe and which are secure on their feet.

In the spring term nursery children need plimsolls
In the summer term they will need a PE kit (t-shirt and shorts)
